THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

ORDINARY TIME I – JANUARY 11

In a couple of weeks we've gone from celebrating the birth of an Infant to witnessing an adult Jesus being baptized by his cousin John in the River Jordan in preparation for his public ministry. This alerts us to the fact that during the liturgical year we don't primarily celebrate historical events but rather we celebrate the unfolding salvation in Jesus Christ. This feast does "double-duty," for it marks both the end of the celebration of Christmas and the beginning of Ordinary Time. It marks Jesus' transition from his private life to his public life of ministry. We mark the transition from the joy of a festal season to the hard work of discipleship that characterizes Ordinary Time.

Prayer

Eternal Father, who at the baptism of Jesus revealed Him to be Your Son, anointing Him with the Holy Spirit: grant that we may be faithful to our call as Children of God, listening to you, guided by Your Spirit, to fulfill our unique and definite purpose. Amen.

Background on the Gospel Reading

Today we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. In today's Gospel we hear John the Baptist contrast his baptism of repentance with the baptism that Jesus will inaugurate. John the Baptist says that he has baptized with water, but that the one who is to come will baptize with the Holy Spirit. John's baptism was not yet a Christian baptism; it was a preparation for the Christian Baptism we celebrate today, and through which sins are forgiven and the gift of the Holy Spirit is received. In accepting John's baptism, Jesus, though sinless, united himself with all sinners.

The baptism of Jesus is reported in each of the three Synoptic Gospels—Matthew, Mark, and Luke. Clearly, Jesus' baptism was an event of great significance for Jesus and for the early Christian community. Mark and Luke report the story from Jesus' perspective; the voice from heaven is addressed to Jesus.

In Matthew's Gospel, the voice from heaven speaks to all who are present. The descent of the Holy Spirit on Jesus at his baptism shows that something new is beginning through the baptism and ministry of Jesus.

The baptism of Jesus is considered an important manifestation of God in the person of Jesus, another epiphany. Jesus' baptism inaugurates his mission. Mark's Gospel moves quickly from the report of Jesus' baptism to Jesus' temptations in the desert to his ministry in Galilee after John's arrest. The end of the ministry of John the Baptist is the beginning of Jesus' ministry. In an analogous way, our Baptism inaugurates our mission as Christians.

Surprisingly, on this the last day of the Christmas season the Gospel does not tell a story from Jesus' childhood. Instead the Gospel reveals Jesus' relationship to God: the Son of Mary and Joseph is also God's own Son. We believe that through Baptism we are also made children of God.

REFLECTION - "Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one with whom I am pleased."

Jesus is the Blessed One. When Jesus was baptized in the Jordan River a voice came from heaven saying: "You are my Son, the Beloved; my favor rests on you" (Mark 1:11). This was the blessing that sustained Jesus during his life. Whatever happened to him - praise or blame - he clung to his blessing; he always remembered that he was the favorite child of God.

Jesus came into the world to share that blessing with us. He came to open our ears to the voice that also says to us, "You are my beloved son, you are my beloved daughter, and my favor rests on you." When we can hear that voice, trust in it, and always remember it, especially during dark times, we can live our lives as God's blessed children and find the strength to share that blessing with others. - Henri Nouwen




Dear Parishioners of St. Rose of Lima Church,



THINKING ABOUT YOUR RMD?

You can make a difference with your Required Minimum Distribution this year. Did you know that you can make a tax-free gift to St. Rose of Lima Church directly from your IRA through a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) in any amount up to \$108,000 in 2025?

When you make a QCD, your gift must go directly from your IRA Trustee to St. Rose and it will not be included as taxable income on your 2025 income tax return.

You must be age 70-1/2 or older at December 31, 2025 to qualify for this double benefit – St. Rose receives your gift and you do not pay tax on the gifted portion of your RMD.

You should make arrangements with your IRA Trustee as soon as possible if you plan on making a QCD this year as the logistics of the transfer to St. Rose may require some additional data gathering and Trustees are usually very busy at year end working on RMDs.

This suggestion does not constitute, and should not be considered as, tax advice and you should discuss this matter with your tax advisor before entering into any transaction with respect to your RMD.
