




MARTIN LUTHER KING DAY REMEMBERING A CHRISTIAN ACTIVIST

Martin Luther King, Jr. (January 15, 1929 – April 4, 1968) was an American clergyman, activist and prominent leader in the African-American civil rights movement. In 1964, King became the youngest person to receive the Nobel Peace Prize for his work to end racial segregation and racial discrimination through civil disobedience and other non-violent means. He was posthumously awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1977 and Congressional Gold Medal in 2004; Martin Luther King, Jr. Day was established as a U.S. national holiday in 1986.

When speaking about how he wished to be remembered, Martin Luther King said: “I’d like somebody to mention that Martin Luther King, Jr., tried to live his life serving others. I’d like for

somebody to say that Martin Luther King, Jr., tried to love somebody. “I want you to be able to say that day that I did try to feed the hungry. I want you to be able to say that I did try in my life to clothe the naked. I want you to say on that day that I did try in my life to visit those who were in prison. And I want you to say that he tried to love and serve humanity.”

POVERTY AWARENESS MONTH

MONDAY, JANUARY 18

Today begins the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, celebrated each year on January 18-25. The 2026 theme is “There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling” (Ephesians 4:4). In a world with diverse and often divided traditions and expressions of Christian faith, Ephesians 4:4 reminds us that all believers are part of the “one body” of Christ. This unity is not about uniformity but a common commitment to the core truths of the Christian faith.

In a historic meeting for the 1,700th anniversary of the first Christian Ecumenical Council, held in Nicaea, Pope Leo XIV and Patriarch Bartholomew issued a joint declaration on Christian unity, saying “We exhort those who are still hesitant to any form of dialogue, to listen to what the Spirit says to the Churches (cf. Rev 2:29), who in the current circumstances of history urges us to present to the world a renewed witness of peace, reconciliation and unity.”

Challenge: Think of Christians in your communities, work, schools and friendships, and reflect on opportunities to work together to serve the most vulnerable.
