GOSPEL

Luke 4:21-30

Jesus began speaking in the synagogue, saying: "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." And all spoke highly of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They also asked, "Isn't this the son of Joseph?" He said to them, "Surely you will quote me this proverb, 'Physician, cure yourself,' and say, 'Do here in your native place the things that we heard were done in Capernaum." And he said, "Amen, I say to you, no prophet is accepted in his own native place. Indeed, I tell you, there were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah when the sky was closed for three and a half years and a severe famine spread over the entire land. It was to none of these that Elijah was sent, but only to a widow in Zarephath in the land of Sidon. Again, there were many lepers in Israel during the time of Elisha the prophet; vet not one of them was cleansed, but only Naaman the Syrian." When the people in the synagogue heard this, they were all filled with fury. They rose up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town had been built, to hurl him down headlong. But Jesus passed through the midst of them and went away.





Word of God Sunday

On January 23, 2022, Word of God Sunday was celebrated with our Candidates for First Communion and their families. The Presentation of the Lord February 2

The Presentation of Jesus in the temple shows him to be the firstborn Son who belongs to the Lord. Jesus is recognized as the long-expected Messiah, the "light of the nations" and the "glory of Israel."

Saint Blaise Thursday, February 3 Mass 8:30 AM

February 3 is the Feast of St. Blaise, the one day on which the church extends the blessing of the throats. Since the ninth century, St. Blaise has been the patron saint for diseases of the throat. From the eighth century he has been invoked on behalf of the sick, especially those afflicted with illnesses of the throat. (Book of





Blessings, no. 1625) We know very little about St. Blaise

beyond the fact that he was a bishop in Armenia, who suffered martyrdom about the year 316. The blessing of the throats on his feast is attributed to his healing of a young boy who was choking to death on a fish bone stuck in his throat. This is why throats are blessed at Masses and other Liturgies on his feast day.

For the blessing, the priest, deacon or other minister touches the throat of each person with crossed candles (blessed on the feast of the Presentation of the Lord) and says: "Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, Bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness; In the name of the Father, and the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, Amen."

Thank you for each of our students who work hard to further their education. We ask you to bless St. Rose of Lima Academy and the many people who advance this mission.


