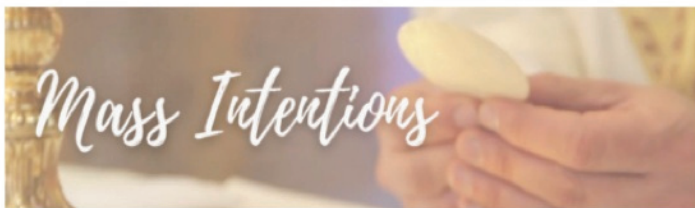




Dear Reverend Harahan,
