Letter from our Pastor



My Dear St. Rose of Lima Family,

Peace!

Two weeks ago, I shared with you some of my experience from my mission immersion trip to Puerto Rico through the Catholic Extension Society. The mission was to see the work that was being done by the Society to help rebuild the Church in Puerto Rico after the devastating hurricane Maria (7 years ago) and some of the other work the Society is supporting. After the masses, some asked if there were some ways that we could support any of these good works. Below are two works that I think we could support, if you so desire.

1. The Hogar Infantil Santa Teresita del Niño Jesús (children's home)

This home has been in existence for 20 years, with the support of the Catholic Extension Society. It houses children from 3 to 8 years of age who have been placed there by the courts due to various forms of physical, mental and sexual abuse, so severe that it resembles torture. The home teaches the children to forgive in order for them to grow into healthy and happy adults. The children are provided with medical and psychological services, healthy food and an education in an environment filled with unlimited love!

2. Centro De Servicios Punta Diamante

This is a center run by the Dominican Sisters of Fatima, founded in Puerto Rico to evangelize families, especially among the poor and vulnerable. The center opens at 9 a.m. and is filled with single elderly people who come for fellowship, a nutritious meal, health care, socialization and they take courses on cooking, sowing, floral arrangements and other workshops. After school, the center is filled with approximately 60 students for tutoring, a meal of rice and some mental and physical health evaluations. The center also has a large chapel as the center of the facility when you walk in the door.

My dear brothers and sisters, these are the two areas that I believe that we can make a difference. If you would like to donate, please make the check payable to St. Rose of Lima, in the memo line put which facility that you would like the money to go to. We will collect during the month of February and then send the money to the respective place. If you have any questions, please feel free to speak with me.





LENTEN REGULATIONS 2026

And so, it begins — the holy and, for some, daunting, season of Lent. This is the season in our liturgical year when the Church encourages us to increase our prayer, fasting and almsgiving in order to enter more deeply into the mystery of our Lord's Passion and Death and Resurrection. To help us, yes, I said "to help us", the Church gives us Lenten "Regulations"; she prescribes a course of actions to guide us. Participation in our Catholic traditions and practices leads to growth in understanding and appreciation.



PRAYER

Lent is a favorable time for letting Christ serve us so that we in turn may become more like him. This happens whenever we hear the word of God and receive the sacraments, especially the Eucharist. There we become what we receive: The Body of Christ.

LENTEN REGULATION

Lenten Regulation: All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. The time for fulfilling this Paschal Precept or Easter Duty extends from the First Sunday of Lent, February 22 to the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity on May 31, 2026.



FASTING

Lent invites us to look inside our heart, with fasting, which frees us from attachment to things and from the worldliness that numbs the heart

It is a summons to stop, to focus on what is essential, to fast from the unnecessary things that distract us. It is a wake-up call for the soul.

LENTEN REGULATION

The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially," or as a whole, is a serious obligation. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during the Lenten season are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence. On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast. On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.



ALMSGIVING

In our Christian life prayer and action are always profoundly united. Prayer that does not lead to concrete action toward your brother or sister who is poor, sick, in need of help is a sterile incomplete prayer.

LENTEN REGULATION

The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.



CONFESION

Even when the door that Baptism opened to enter into the Church is closed a bit because of our weakness and our sins, Confession reopens it, because it is like a second Baptism that forgives us all and illuminates us to go forward with the light of the Lord.


LENTEN REGULATION

The faithful are to be encouraged to participate in the sacrament of Penance during Lent. It is a beautiful season to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation. As we realize more deeply the goodness of God, we also become more aware of the ways we have failed to live as we should.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The cross speaks to us of the supreme love of God and invites, today, to renew our faith in the power of that love, and to believe that in every situation of our lives, our history and our world, God is able to vanquish death, sin and evil, and to give us new, risen life. During the season of Lent, there is a rich tradition of celebrating the Way of the Cross, both privately and publically. This devotion helps to prepare us for the celebration of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

KIDZ & FASTING

As we approach Lent, it might be helpful to review some information about fasting and abstinence. There are many kinds of fasts, and several reasons to fast. As Catholics, we tend to think of fasting as either reducing our food intake or giving up a treasured treat.

Traditionally there are four reasons for fasting:

1. Preparation for a feast
2. Penance and atonement for sins
3. Acknowledgment that all we have comes from God
4. Solidarity with those who live in want

While our fasting might be for all of these reasons, in Lent we tend to focus on the first two.

What is a fast?

But are we really fasting? Lent begins with the story of Jesus' fast in the desert—a fast of 40 days without food. Many of us have probably never been 40 hours without food. The definition of a fast for Catholics is eating only one full meal a day along with two smaller meals—a light breakfast and lunch and a normal dinner, for example. That's pretty much what I eat every day, so it's really not much of a fast.

As Catholics, we are required to fast only two days out of the year—Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The requirement to fast applies only to those who are between the ages of 18 and 60. I guess the thinking is that going without food would not be healthy for children and seniors. Really, though, all the fast asks of them is to not snack between meals, so I'm thinking we can encourage the fast for everyone, no matter what their age. The U.S. bishops recommend (but don't require) that every day of Lent be a fast day. Given the very generous Catholic definition of fasting that seems easily doable for the more devout among us.

What about meatless Fridays?

Technically, going without meat on Fridays is not fasting; it is abstaining. Presumably you can eat until you burst, as long as there is no animal flesh on your Friday menu. Older Catholics can remember when all Fridays were abstinence days. Now, only Ash Wednesday, the Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday are so designated. And the age range is expanded. The rule applies to all those 14 and older.

One thing a lot of Catholics don't know is that every Friday of the year is still designated as a penitential day. We are supposed to do some penitential act, such as abstaining from meat. **The difference between today and my childhood is that the penitential act can be anything we want. It doesn't have to be giving up meat, but we still have to do something.** The Catechism of the Catholic Church lists 20 different penitential actions. Below are some penitential actions that KIDZ can do:

❖ gestures of reconciliation	❖ reading Scripture
❖ concern for the poor	❖ praying a psalm
❖ Saying I am sorry	❖ praying the Lord's Prayer
❖ examination of conscience	❖ going to confession
❖ Going to Mass	❖ sharing


