2023 LENTEN REGULATIONS

 The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

- The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the <u>First Sunday of Lent</u>, <u>February 26</u> to <u>The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity</u>, <u>June 4, 2023.</u>

*Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.



I embrace You as if You have already come, and unite myself wholly to You.



We celebrate Ash Wednesday, marking the beginning of the Lenten Season. Take inspiration for your Lenten journey from prayer and the reading of Scripture, from fasting and from giving alms.

Distribution of Ashes to children There are no age requirements for the celebration or reception of most sacraments, including blessed ashes on Ash Wednesday. Even if children lack the use of reason, their reception of the ashes indicates they fully belong to a community in need of forgiveness that wants to be on the Lenten journey of conversion.

PRAYER Lent is essentially an act of prayer spread out over 40 days. As we pray, we are brought closer to Christ and are changed by the encounter with him.

FASTING The fasting that we all do together on Fridays is but a sign of the daily Lenten discipline of individuals and households: fasting for certain periods of time, fasting from certain foods, but also fasting from other things and activities.

ALMSGIVING The giving of alms is an effort to share this world equally—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents.

Lenten Regulations

What is so radical to me about Christianity is that it is not a bunch of do's and don'ts
— it is about a new way of living. — Pope Francis

And so, it begins — the holy and, for some, daunting, season of Lent. This is the season in our liturgical year when the Church encourages us to increase our prayer, fasting and almsgiving in order to enter more deeply into the mystery of our Lord's Passion and Death and Resurrection. To help us, yes, I said "to help us", the Church gives us Lenten "Regulations"; she prescribes a course of actions to guide us. Participation in our Catholic traditions and practices leads to growth in understanding and appreciation.

PRAYER Lent is a favorable time for letting Christ serve us so that we in turn may become more like him. This happens whenever we hear the word of God and receive the sacraments, especially the Eucharist. There we become what we receive: The Body of Christ. —Pope Francis

LENTEN REGULATION: All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. The time for fulfilling this Paschal Precept or Easter Duty extends from the First Sunday of Lent, February 26 to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 4, 2023.

FASTING Lent invites us to look inside our heart, with fasting, which frees us from attachment to things and from the worldliness that numbs the heart. It is a summons to stop, to focus on what is essential, to fast from the unnecessary things that distract us. It is a wake-up call for the soul. —Pope Francis

LENTEN REGULATION: The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

OPERATION RICE BOWL This Lent, put your faith in action with CRS Rice Bowl, Catholic Relief Services' Lenten program to pray, fast, learn and give. Rice Bowls will be collected during Holy Week during collections for the poor.

WHY GO TO CONFESSION DURING LENT

CONFESSION Even when the door that Baptism opened to enter into the Church is closed a bit because of our weakness and our sins, Confession reopens it, because it is like a second Baptism that forgives us all and illuminates us to go forward with the light of the Lord.—Pope Francis

LENTEN SUGGESTION: The faithful are to be encouraged to participate in the sacrament of Penance during Lent. It is a beautiful season to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation. As we realize more deeply the goodness of God, we also become more aware of the ways we have failed to live as we should.

WHY GO TO STATIONS OF THE CROSS

STATIONS The cross speaks to us of the supreme love of God and invites, today, to renew our faith in the power of that love, and to believe that in every situation of our lives, our history and our world, God is able to vanquish death, sin and evil, and to give us new, risen life.

LENTEN SUGGESTION: During the season of Lent, there is a rich tradition of celebrating the Way of the Cross, both privately and publically. This devotion helps to prepare us for the celebration of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

Ash Wednesday February 22, 2023 WHY ASHES?

Why make the sign of the cross on our foreheads with a smudge of ashes on the first day of Lent?

Since ancient times, ashes have been a symbol of sorrow. After burning wood in a fireplace, the house-holder is left with ashes that need to be cleaned up. Having ashes on our foreheads is a sign that we are feeling the sorrow and guilt of sin that we need to set about the work of cleaning up, of ridding ourselves of the burden and sorrow of sin.

Lent is the time to prepare for Easter, and we prepare best by feeling sorry for our sins and turning away from them. We resolve to sin no more and to be ready to celebrate the new life of Easter as new persons.

Ashes are also a symbol of our own mortality. When Adam and Eve disobey, God tells them they will have a life of toil and suffering. God also tells them they will die: "...you are dust, and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19). During Lent we are asked to recall that death is our destiny and that Lent is the time to prepare for the new Easter life that Jesus brings.

The ashes we receive on Ash Wednesday are made by burning the palm branches left over from last year's Palm Sunday procession. Some oil is added to make the ashes stick to our foreheads. As you receive ashes, listen to the minister to say, "Repent and believe in the Gospel" (Mark 1:15), or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you will return" (Genesis 3:19).

KIDZ & FASTING

What is a fast?

But are we really fasting? Lent begins with the story of Jesus' fast in the desert—a fast of 40 days without food. Many of us have probably never been 40 hours without food. The definition of a fast for Catholics is eating only one full meal a day along with two smaller meals—a light breakfast and lunch and a normal dinner, for example. That's pretty much what I eat every day, so it's really not much of a fast.

As Catholics, we are required to fast only two days out of the year—Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The requirement to fast applies only to those who are between the ages of 18 and 60. I guess the thinking is that going without food would not be healthy for children and seniors.

Really, though, all the fast asks of them is to not snack between meals, so I'm thinking we can encourage the fast for everyone, no matter what their age.

What about meatless Fridays?

Technically, going without meat on Fridays is not fasting; it is abstaining. Presumably you can eat until you burst, as long as there is no animal flesh on your Friday menu. Older Catholics can remember when all Fridays were abstinence days. Now, only Ash Wednesday, the Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday are so designated. And the age range is expanded. The rule applies to all those 14 and older.

One thing a lot of Catholics don't know is that every Friday of the year is still designated as a penitential day. We are supposed to do some penitential act, such as abstaining from meat. The difference between today and my childhood is that the penitential act can be anything we want. It doesn't have to be giving up meat, but we still have to do something.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church lists 20 different penitential actions. Below are some penitential actions that KIDZ can do:

- Gestures Of Reconciliation
- Concern For The Poor
- Saying I Am Sorry
- Examination Of Conscience
- Going To Mass

- Reading Scripture
- Praying A Psalm
- Praying The Lord's Prayer
- Going To Confession
- Sharing






Stewardship Reflection for the Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time




