

Letter from our Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

As ashes are distributed we are reminded, "You are dust and to dust you shall return." Or we may hear the words, "Turn away from sins and believe in the gospel." We are human – no more, no less. Jesus enters into our world as one of us, to lift our human lives as He lifted His own on the cross. To be united with Him is to be transformed in our humanity. We need strength. We look for answers. We search for wisdom. We yearn for lighter burdens. Lent is the journey toward the promise of love given as we turn from sin and receive the power of grace in the dust of everyday life.

We enter the season of Lent with a desire to turn from our sins. Fasting, almsgiving and prayer open our hearts to see beyond the "dust" of this life and grasp the greater life beyond what our eyes can see. "Giving up" something reminds us of the dependence we have on God. Alcohol, cookies, TV, time on social media, attachments to our cell phones and mindless distractions all may be starting points for renewing our hearts. These small sacrifices put us in touch with the One whose sacrifice on Good Friday redeems us. "Giving up" allows more time for our hearts to give.

This year we have a special reason to repent. Pope Francis has urged us to pray and fast for peace in Ukraine:

"I invite everyone to make next March 2^{nd} , Ash Wednesday, a day of fasting for peace. I encourage believers in a special way to devote themselves intensely to prayer and fasting on that day. May the Queen of Peace preserve the world from the madness of war."

Coming to Mass more frequently, praying at Mass more attentively, becoming more conscious of our duties and responsibilities, refocusing our priorities, all serve to "shake the dust" of routine and self-centeredness from our hearts. May these also serve the cause of peace.

The ashes will be gone quickly. But throughout the days of Lent may we be blessed on the journey toward Easter. Let us pray for peace.

I embrace You as if You have already come, and unite myself wholly to You.







WHY ASHES?

Why make the sign of the cross on our foreheads with a smudge of ashes on the first day of Lent?

Since ancient times, ashes have been a symbol of sorrow. After burning wood in a fireplace, the householder is left with ashes that need to be cleaned up. Having ashes on our foreheads is a sign that we are feeling the sorrow and guilt of sin that we need to set about the work of cleaning up, of ridding ourselves of the burden and sorrow of sin.

Lent is a time to prepare for Easter, and we prepare best by feeling sorry for our sins and turning away from them. We resolve to sin no more and to be ready to celebrate the new life of Easter as new persons.

Ashes are also a symbol of our own mortality. When Adam and Eve disobey, God tells them they will have a life of toil and suffering. God also tells them they will die: "...you are dust, and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19). During Lent we are asked to recall that death is our destiny and that Lent is the time to prepare for the new Easter life that Jesus brings.


The ashes we receive on Ash Wednesday are made by burning the palm branches left over from last year's Palm Sunday procession. Some oil is added to make the ashes stick to our foreheads. As you receive ashes, listen for the minister to say, "Repent and believe in the Gospel" (Mark 1:15), or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you will return" (Genesis 3:19).

ON THE DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES TO CHILDREN

There are no age requirements for the celebration or reception of most sacramentals, including blessed ashes on Ash Wednesday. Even if children lack the use of reason, their reception of the ashes indicates they fully belong to a community in need of forgiveness that wants to be on the Lenten journey of conversion.



Pandemic or not, it's time for Lent — the holy and in the midst of a pandemic a seemingly daunting, season of Lent. It is very tempting in this time of COVID 19 to put aside the season of Lent with its regulations and practices. The Church gives us Lenten "Regulations" that are" not a bunch of do's and don'ts"! The Church encourages prayer, fasting and almsgiving as a course of actions to guide us and help us navigate this new way of living. And so, it begins!

PRAYER Lent is a favorable time for letting Christ serve us so that we in turn may become more like him. This happens whenever we hear the word of God and receive the sacraments, especially the Eucharist. There we become what we receive: The Body of Christ. —Pope Francis

LENTEN REGULATION: All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. The time for fulfilling this Paschal Precept or Easter Duty extends from the First Sunday of Lent, March 6 to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 12.

FASTING Lent invites us to look inside our heart, with fasting, which frees us from attachment to things and from the worldliness that numbs the heart. It is a summons to stop, to focus on what is essential, to fast from the unnecessary things that distract us. It is a wake-up call for the soul. —Pope Francis

LENTEN REGULATION: The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially," or as a whole, is a serious obligation. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence. On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast. On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

ALMSGIVING In our Christian life too prayer and action are always profoundly united. Prayer that does not lead to concrete action toward a sister or brother who is poor, sick, in need of help is a sterile and incomplete prayer. —Pope Francis

LENTEN REGULATION: The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

OPERATION RICE BOWL As we look ahead to our Lenten journey, may our fasting be a hunger for justice, our alms an offering of peace, and our prayers a reflection of humble and grateful hearts. This Lent put your faith in action with CRS Rice Bowl, Catholic Relief Services' Lenten program to pray, fast, learn and give. DEAR FRIEND IN CHRIST,

I am excited to share an amazing event with you that will happen at the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart. Arte Divine, Patrons of the Arts in the Vatican Museums have been authorized to recreate Michelangelo's masterpiece Pietà in cast marble using a mold derived from the original Pietà (c. 1498-99, located in St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City). This Pietà recreation is a precise "one to one" casting that is faithful in every detail to Michelangelo's original. It is Arte Divine's mission to place Michelangelo's Pietà in one hundred cathedrals, hospitals, or academic institutions around the world — in settings where they can enlighten minds and touch the lives and hearts of the faithful.

Arte Divine will be delivering Michelangelo's iconic sculpture to the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart on March 7, 2022, for a period of 120 days. During this time, the Cathedral Basilica will be open to all the parishes of the Archdiocese of Newark to visit and admire this exquisite casting.

You don't have to travel to Rome to witness this masterpiece! For a limited time, the Pietà will be close to home in Newark, NJ.

I hope to see you and your parish soon at the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart.






