

POST PANDEMIC LITURGY DIRECTIVES

The outbreak of the Covid-19 Pandemic in 2020 required a temporary reduction of liturgical practices in the celebration of the Eucharist and administration of the sacraments. With almost all aspects of life returning to normalcy, it seems opportune for the Archdiocese of Newark to foster a renewed fullness in liturgical celebrations.

Beginning as early as the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 6, 2023, but no later than Pentecost Sunday, May 28, 2023, all pandemic reductions and accommodations are abrogated and minimalistic tendencies in the celebration of liturgical rites are to be eliminated.

Receiving the Blood of Christ

In the Gospel of Matthew, at the Last Supper, Jesus specifically commanded his disciples to "eat" and "drink" his Body and Blood. This command is at the heart of all our worship—the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

Communion from the chalice is being restored now, so that all may have the opportunity to participate more fully in the celebration of the Eucharist. The church rightly teaches that whoever receives Communion under only one kind receives the whole Christ, "Body and Blood, soul and divinity," since the living Lord is totally and completely present in each of the species. However, it also states that "Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds" (GIRM, 281).

Beginning as early as the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 6, 2023, but no later than Pentecost Sunday, May 28, 2023, parishes across the Archdiocese of Newark will once again begin offering the Blood of Christ at Mass. This will allow all parishioners to respond to Jesus' command to eat and drink at their own level of comfort.

Parishioners wishing to receive Holy Communion from the chalice should approach the minister and bow their head slightly in a sign of reverence. When the minister says "The Blood of Christ," the communicant replies audibly, "Amen," takes the chalice from the minister and drinks. The minister then takes it back and firmly wipes both sides of the rim while turning it slightly for the next communicant.

"The consecrated host may be received either on the tongue or in the hand, at the discretion of each communicant" (GIRM, 160).

Eating and drinking the Body and Blood of the Lord fulfills his Last Supper command, commemorates his sacrifice on the Cross, and moves believers into a deeper participation in the Eucharist.

"If he is a sinner, I do not know.

One thing I do know is that I was blind and now I see."

So they said to him,

"What did he do to you?

How did he open your eyes?"

He answered them,

"I told you already and you did not listen.

Why do you want to hear it again?

Do you want to become his disciples, too?"

They ridiculed him and said,

"You are that man's disciple;

we are disciples of Moses!

We know that God spoke to Moses,

but we do not know where this one is from."

The man answered and said to them,

"This is what is so amazing,

that you do not know where he is from, yet he opened my eyes.

We know that God does not listen to sinners.

but if one is devout and does his will, he listens to him.

It is unheard of that anyone ever opened the eyes of a person born blind.

If this man were not from God,

he would not be able to do anything."

They answered and said to him,

"You were born totally in sin,

and are you trying to teach us?"

Then they threw him out.

When Jesus heard that they had thrown him out,

he found him and said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?"

He answered and said,

"Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?"

Jesus said to him,

"You have seen him,

the one speaking with you is he."

Ha coid

"I do believe, Lord," and he worshiped him.

Then Jesus said,

"I came into this world for judgment,

so that those who do not see might see,

and those who do see might become blind."

Some of the Pharisees who were with him heard this and said to him, "Surely we are not also blind, are we?" lesus said to them.

"If you were blind, you would have no sin;

but now you are saying, 'We see,' so your sin remains.

I believe that you are present in the most Blessed Sacrament.


I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul.

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT



The traditional name for the Fourth Sunday of Lent is Laetare Sunday. This title comes from Laetare Jerusalem, "Rejoice, Jerusalem," the first words of today's entrance antiphon. As we have reached the midpoint of Lent, we anticipate the joy of Easter.

REFLECTION - LENT 4, REJOICE?

Lent takes a decisive turn toward Easter this Sunday: rose vestments may replace violet. The entrance antiphon and opening prayer sound the keynote: "Rejoice, Jerusalem! Be glad for her!" (antiphon); "Let us hasten toward Easter with eagerness" (opening prayer). The readings also sound a joyful theme. In the first reading, the election of David has the prophet learning that the vision of God is not our vision, and God chooses people not by sight but by what it is in their hearts. In the gospel, the blind man's faith journey is difficult: The man starts in a darkness that is absolute: blind from birth, he has never seen the light. The end of the journey is Jesus who is "the light of the world." St. Paul reminds us that we should live as children of light. Overall, then, the liturgy is full of good news. Lent will soon be over; Easter is on the way. God's promises will be fulfilled, and God's mercy knows no end. We cannot but rejoice in such a God; we cannot but give thanks, for the one who "was dead has come back to life" (communion antiphon). Such a message is certain to put wind in our Lenten sails, encouraging us to redouble our efforts at renewal.
