Palm Sunday Lord's Passion



The Proclamation of the Passion is central to the liturgy on this final Sunday of Lent. Because this is a B year in the three-year cycle of Sunday readings, the Passion according to Mark is read. Lent ends on the afternoon of Holy Thursday. The season known as Triduum begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on that evening. Triduum is celebrated as a unit which is why the Mass of the Lord's Supper and the liturgy for Good Friday have no concluding rites. The final blessing does not occur until the end of Mass at the Easter Vigil

A PALM SUNDAY PRAYER

Almighty, ever-living God, You have given the human race Jesus Christ our Savior as a model of humility. He fulfilled your will by becoming man and giving his life on the cross.

Help us to bear witness to you by following his example of suffering and make us worthy to share in his resurrection.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

"CRUCIFY HIM"

The message of the liturgy in proclaiming the passion narratives in full is to enable the assembly to see vividly the love of Christ for each person, despite their sins, a love that even death could not vanquish. The crimes during the Passion of Christ cannot be attributed indiscriminately to all Jews of that time, nor to Jews today. The Jewish people should not be referred to as though rejected or cursed, as if this view followed from Scriptures. The Church even keeps in mind that Jesus, his mother Mary, and the Apostles were all Jewish. As the Church has always held, Christ freely suffered his passion and death because of the sins of all, that all might be saved.


(USCCB) The proclamation of the passion at SRL will be proclaimed in full with shifts in voice by scene rather than by narrator/speaker.


PASSIONTIDE - TABLE PRAYER

Jesus, Lamb of God, obedient to death that we might have life. Be with us as we share this food, that we too may discover the strength born of weakness. Worthy are you, Lamb of God, to receive blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever. Amen

REFLECTION—THE PASSION

The assembly that gathers to hear the proclamation of the Passion hears a familiar story. There will be no new characters in the cast, no sudden shift in plot line that cannot be anticipated, no surprise ending. We have heard the story before. This year when we hear the Passion it will be with the understanding that throughout the story we find bits and pieces of who we are today. There is something in all of us of the women and men of Christ's Passion. We who are heirs to what Paul remembered, what the church remembered over all these years, are also the ones who must leave the story to the next generation. We must ensure that it is not forgotten or lost in a world that offers so many conflicting notions of meaning and memory. We believe that somehow in the mystery of retelling the story, it comes to life for us, draws us beyond the moment and sustains us in its image. Through this story, like no other, we can trace our own passage from life, through death, to life again!

Individual Rite of Penance

(Confession)

GOING TO CONFESSION

The Church designates this Lenten Season of preparation as an important time to receive the sacrament of Penance also known as the Sacrament of Reconciliation. In this sacrament, we examine our life and we seek forgiveness for those things, those actions that keep us from letting the Lord more deeply in our heart.

Many people have avoided celebrating the Sacrament of Penance, sometimes for years at a time, because they "don't know what to do." The following brief explanation is intended for a person who has not been to confession in some time or for an adult who is going for the first time. It explains how the first form of the Sacrament of Penance may be celebrated. The person who is going to confession is called a "penitent" because he or she wishes to do penance and to turn away from sin.

PREPARATION

Before going to confession, the penitent compares his or her life with the Ten Commandments, the Beatitudes, and the example of Christ and then prays to God for forgiveness.

GOING TO CONFESSION

- 1) The Sign of the Cross
- 2) Greeting Peace be with you! And with your spirit.

THE WORD OF GOD

Scripture these past Sundays is filled with the message to repent and prepare for the coming of Christ. How are you preparing? For what do you need God's mercy and forgiveness?

CONFESSION OF SINS

The priest then offers suitable advice to help the penitent begin a new life and, when appropriate, leads him or her to resolve to make appropriate restitution for the harm he or she has caused others. The priest imposes an act of penance or satisfaction on the penitent.

The Prayer of the Penitent

After this, the penitent prays a prayer expressing sorrow for his or her sins and resolving not to sin again. The penitent may recite the prayer by heart or read it.

PRAYER OF THE PENITENT: ACT OF CONTRITION

My God.

I am sorry for my sins with all my heart.

In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good,

I have sinned against you

whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more,

and to avoid whatever leads me to sin.

Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us.

In his name, my God, have mercy.

ABSOLUTION BY THE PRIEST

Following this prayer, the priest extends his hands, or at least his right hand, over the head of the penitent and pronounces the formula of absolution. As he says the final words he makes the sign of the cross over the head of the penitent:

PROCLAMATION OF PRAISE

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God!

Response: It is right and just.

DISMISSAL OF THE PENITENT

Priest: Go in the peace of Christ.

Response: Thanks be to God.


Do you know anyone who is homebound and unable to get to Mass? Recovering from a hospitalization or illness?




