

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT



Prior to the calendar reform brought about by Vatican II, the Fifth Sunday of Lent was called Passion Sunday and ushered in a season known as Passiontide wherein we focused on the Lord's suffering and death. Those in our assemblies who are old enough will recall purple-draped statues creating the atmosphere for this end-of-Lent season.

We no longer divide Lent in this way, but keep its penitential and baptismal focus until we enter Holy Week on Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion.

MORE ON PASSIONTIDE

- † The two weeks before Easter, formerly called Passiontide were marked by a liturgy whose tone was somber and severe. All statues and crucifixes were veiled with purple cloth that was removed at the Easter Vigil (save for the crucifix, which was uncovered as a part of the Good Friday Liturgy). These external observances were viewed as signs of penitential preparation for Easter.
- † The present reform, however, is a return to an older tradition in which initiation and reconciliation were the ways that communities observed Lent and prepared for Easter. The communal observance of Lent stressed sacramental celebrations rather than external and ceremonial details.
- † Today's liturgy begins to turn our attention toward the death and resurrection of Jesus.

PREPARING FOR THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE

The Church designated this Lenten Season of preparation as an important time to receive the sacrament of Penance also know as the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Lent is the principal time of penance both for individual Christians and for the whole church. This sacrament helps to prepare the Christian community for a fuller sharing in the Paschal Mystery. In this sacrament, we examine our life and we seek forgiveness for those things, those actions that keep us from letting the Lord

more deeply in our heart. Remember, (I)t is the Spirit who impels each of us to "return into ourselves" and to see the need to go back to the Father's house. If you have been away from penance for some time, this is the perfect time, and the perfect way to come and celebrate God's mercy. The following questions (examination of conscience) may help you prepare for our service. The Examination of conscience is one of the most decisive moments of life. It places each individual before the truth of one's own life. (JP II)

- Do I sincerely want to be set free from sin, to turn again to God, to begin a new life, and to enter into a deeper friendship with God?
- God spoke to us in his Son, Jesus. Have I been careful to listen to God's word and grow in my understanding of faith? Am I
 faithful to the Church's teaching? Where is my life really leading me? Is the hope of eternal life my inspiration?
- Is my heart set on God? Do I really love God above all things? Do I pray? Do I take time to raise my mind and heart to God
 or am I concerned only about the matters of this world? Do I keep Sundays and holy days by full participation in Mass? Have
 I fulfilled the precept of annual confession and of communion during the Easter season?
- Have I a genuine love for my family? Do I love my neighbor? Does you love reach across the boundaries of religion, race, ethnicity, gender and disabling conditions? Are you concerned about the poor?
- Do I have a genuine respect for life? Do I protect human life? Do I promote human dignity? Do I work to preserve God's creation? Do I work for Gospel charity, justice and peace?

Reflection-Lent Is Home!

"A few years ago James Carroll (writer and former Paulist priest) wrote an article entitled Lent Was Once My Home. I have forgotten the content of the article but the title is somewhat telling. Lent was one of those "homing moments" for Catholics. Despite the variety of issues that might divide the community's heads, their hearts were united by a common experience of human mortality, a common experience of sinfulness and needfulness before God. Above all they felt a knowledge that Christians were in this together, and that, at least for 40 days, the death and rising of the Lord Jesus would bind the community as one. Lent is the HOME of all Christians, seekers of the holy life, who recognize their sinfulness and need of healing." And so Sunday after Sunday, the community proclaims I confess...
