3RD SUNDAY OF EASTER



THE PASCHAL CANDLE should stand in the sanctuary during the entire season of Easter. This candle symbolizes the risen Christ who conquers sin and death and, for that reason, is lit during baptisms and usually at funerals as well. Each year, a new paschal candle is prepared during the opening rites at the Easter Vigil. It is marked with a cross, an alpha and omega, and the numerals of the year. Five grains of incense, representing the wounds of Christ, are also embedded into the wax.

REFLECTION— "He was made known to them in the breaking of bread." (Luke 24)

Usually this is where the story of Emmaus ends, with this line of coming to recognize him, their eyes were no longer restrained; in the action of Jesus' feeding them, the story is over. This is the way the story is told when used as a description of the liturgy, and yet it is not a natural way to break the line or stop the story. It continues amazingly, the telling summons the presence of the Risen Lord: While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." Just as Jesus' breaking of the bread caused them to recognize his presence among them for hours while he opened their minds and stirred their hearts back to life on the road, now our telling of the stories, literally, telling of how we encounter and come to recognize Jesus in the breaking of the bread and Word in our lives and in the larger history of the world community, we summon the presence of the Risen Lord among us! The peace of the Risen Lord is summoned by our telling of the stories of Scripture and letting that story rewrite our own lives and futures. The peace of Christ comes to the community as we announce the Good News to one another.

Living THE Stations 2024

On the evening of Palm Sunday our Confirmation candidates participated in a unique portrayal of the Stations of the Cross. Our "Living the Stations" is a key component of our preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Confirmation candidates, in their own words, share how they interpret the significance of each station and how it relates to their lives and the world they see around them.


