

May 1, 2022

Acts 5:27-32, 40b-41 / Revelation 5:11-14 / John 21:1-19

READING I

Acts 5:27-32

When the captain and the court officers had brought the apostles in and made them stand before the Sanhedrin, the high priest questioned them, "We gave you strict orders, did we not, to stop teaching in that name? Yet you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and want to bring this man's blood upon us." But Peter and the apostles said in reply, "We must obey God rather than men. The God of our ancestors raised Jesus, though you had him killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as leader and savior to grant Israel repentance and forgiveness of sins. We are witnesses of these things, as is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him." The Sanhedrin ordered the apostles to stop speaking in the name of Jesus, and dismissed them. So they left the presence of the Sanhedrin, rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name. **RESPONSORIAL PSALM** Ps 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11-12, 13 R. THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

THE PASCHAL CANDLE should stand in the



sanctuary during the entire season of Easter. This candle symbolizes the risen Christ who conquers sin and death and, for that reason, is lit during baptisms and usually at funerals as well. Each year, a new

paschal candle is prepared during the opening rites at the Easter Vigil. It is marked with a cross, an alpha and omega, and the numerals of the year. Five grains of incense, representing the wounds of Christ, are also embedded into the wax.

REFLECTION — Being a Resurrected People

Writing to her nephew, who no longer felt Catholicism relevant at the end of his first year in college, Flannery O'Connor wrote: "You are just beginning to realize how difficult it is to have faith and the measure of required commitment to it, but you are too young to decide you don't have faith just because you feel you can't believe. About the only way we know whether we believe or not is by what we do. You have taken the path of least resistance and simply decided you have lost your faith and there is nothing you can do about it. There is a very simple way of strengthening your faith, and that is to give alms." The resurrection is about much more than Jesus being raised from the dead. The new order that the resurrection establishes means that we witness by our very LIVING! This is the Easter challenge for all of us!



Send your Holy Spirit to help others to respond generously and courageously to your call. May our community of faith support vocations of sacrificial love in our youth and young adults.



The event is part of the United States' 70th observance of the National Day of Prayer that was established by Congress


in 1952. At our local service, prayers will be offered for our world, our nation, our military, government leaders, media, schools, houses of worship and families.
