March 2023 Update

Where are we?

1. During this Easter Season, our family has grown in the following ways:
 - a. 2 people were baptized at the Easter Vigil
 - b. 4 Adults were welcomed into full Communion through Confirmation with three (3) of them receiving the Body and Blood of our Lord for the first time.
 - c. 53 of our children received the Eucharist for the first time.
 - d. 53 young people will be Confirmed on 28 May 2023
2. SRLA
 - a. 14 young gentlemen and ladies will graduate from the Academy on Friday, 2 June 2023
 - b. These 14 students have received a combined total of \$578,000 in scholarships and grants for high school with one student receiving a scholarship of \$64,000 a year for four years above and beyond the above referenced number.
3. Update on the three (3) major projects
 - a. Sound System
 - i. The new sound system has been fully installed. The actual cost was \$105,510. Through the generosity of some of our family members, BSA Troop 17, the Ladies Auxiliary and the Knights of Columbus, this cost has been offset by \$50,700 costing the parish \$54,810 – Thank you!
 - b. HVAC System
 - i. All the equipment has been purchased. The system in the Devine Center is complete.
 - ii. The work for the HVAC system in the Church is being postponed until September. The reason for the postponement is that to do the work needed in the Church, we must add some safety features as per OSHA requirements and the work requires architectural drawings and then approval. We are in the process of completing the architectural drawings. Our current system will be able to carry us through this summer.
 - c. Church Steps
 - i. Due to cost increases for the necessary materials, and having only received ½ of the \$400,000, we have decided to postpone the project until June 2024. We will send the project out to for rebidding and hope to have the full \$400,000 by the end of the year. We are committed to moving forward with this project.

4. Annual Appeal

- a. We have collected \$62,000 of the needed \$113,000. We are truly hoping to receive the full cash in hand no later than 30 June 2023 to give us savings next year of \$22,000.

5. Solar Panels

- a. I have signed a contract with an Archdiocesan approved and vetted solar company to put solar panels on the roof of the school and construct a canopy in the parking lot to place panels. The canopy construction and approval will probably have to go before the Zoning Board. This move will greatly reduce our electric bills in the future.

6. Parking Space

- a. We were able to rent 25 of the 50 spaces we have available. This yielded \$14,940 for this fiscal year with the hope of increased revenue from leasing all 50 spaces.

- 7. My goal is to not only keep a balanced budget, but also to build up our reserves in a consistent way so that we do not have to ask our parish family for additional resources other than the Annual Appeal goal each year. The parish staff and Finance Council are working hard to find cutting programs and grants while not reducing the quality of the services.

This feast commemorates the visitation of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth after receiving the message of the angel, Gabriel. Of this event, St. Ambrose of Milan writes the following:

When the angel revealed his message to the Virgin Mary he gave her a sign to win her trust. He told her of the motherhood of an old and barren woman to show that God is able to do all that he wills.

When she hears this Mary sets out for the hill country. She does not disbelieve God's word; she feels no uncertainty over the message or doubt about the sign. She goes eager in purpose, dutiful in conscience, hastening for joy.

Filled with God, where would she hasten but to the heights? The Holy Spirit does not proceed by slow, laborious efforts. Quickly, too, the blessings of her coming and the Lord's presence are made clear: as soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting the child leapt in her womb, and she was filled with the Holy Spirit.

JUNE 1 • MEMORIAL OF ST. JUSTIN

Martyr for Sunday

St. Justin, apologist and martyr, was one of the most important Christian writers of the second century. He himself tells how his study of all the schools of philosophy led him to Christianity, and how he dedicated his life to the defense of the Christian faith as "the one certain and profitable philosophy."

St. Justin is particularly celebrated for the two Apologies which he was courageous enough to address in succession to the persecuting emperors Antoninus and Marcus Aurelius. One of them contains a description of the rites of baptism and the Sunday gatherings, thus constituting the most valuable evidence that we possess on the Roman liturgy of his day. He was martyred in Rome in 165.

Our Sunday Obligation



“Much obliged” is an old fashioned phrase first noted in the Old Oxford English Dictionary in the sixteenth century. Over the centuries, the phrase has lost some of its richness. Originally, it meant to be bound to a person by ties of gratitude. Today, the phrase is more often used as an automatic response to someone who has performed a perfunctory service. Unfortunately, this practice does not convey the sense of truly being bound to each other by gratitude. What a loss! Because of that loss, many people understand the word obligation as a burden rather than a commitment and duty that flows from a relationship. Obligation is a form of indebtedness that comes from within the heart of a relationship. Think of the obligations that make for a rich family life. A parent does not say, “I wonder if I have to feed my children this week?” Husbands and wives carry out a myriad of obligatory tasks in service to each other during the course of a week and never ask, “Do I have to?” In loving relationships, we are grateful for the gift of each other and we express that gratitude by doing right actions because we want to do so. Obligatory behaviors grow out of communication, intimacy, and personal and communal relationships. These examples can help us reflect on our “obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #2041).

The heart of Sunday obligation is gratitude. The word Eucharist means “to give thanks.” We gather each week because we are “much obliged” to God — for everything. This obligation is not an automatic response to someone who has performed a perfunctory service. We come together to “give thanks” to God, our Father who is the source of all life and creation, and to Jesus, God’s Son who gave us eternal life through his death on the Cross that is made present in every Mass as we participate again in Christ’s death and Resurrection through the Eucharist.

Each time we “attend Mass,” we bring our lives, our very selves, to the Eucharist. We gather together as a community, grateful to have each other as fellow pilgrims in faith and grateful to be nourished by the body and blood of Christ. Just as the relationships and obligations in families are nurtured and strengthened by intimacy and communion, so too does our participation in the Eucharist nurture and strengthen our relationship with the Trinity. Food nourishes our body in the same way that our participation in Holy Communion nourishes our spirit and unites us together as individuals and as a community in Christ. Acting on our Sunday obligation of being “much obliged” gives us reason to be “more obliged” in the most authentic sense of obligation. - Maureen A. Kelly

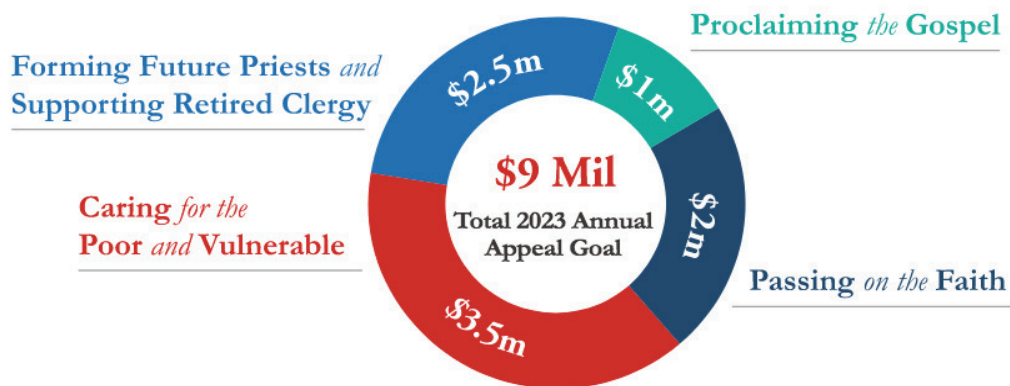

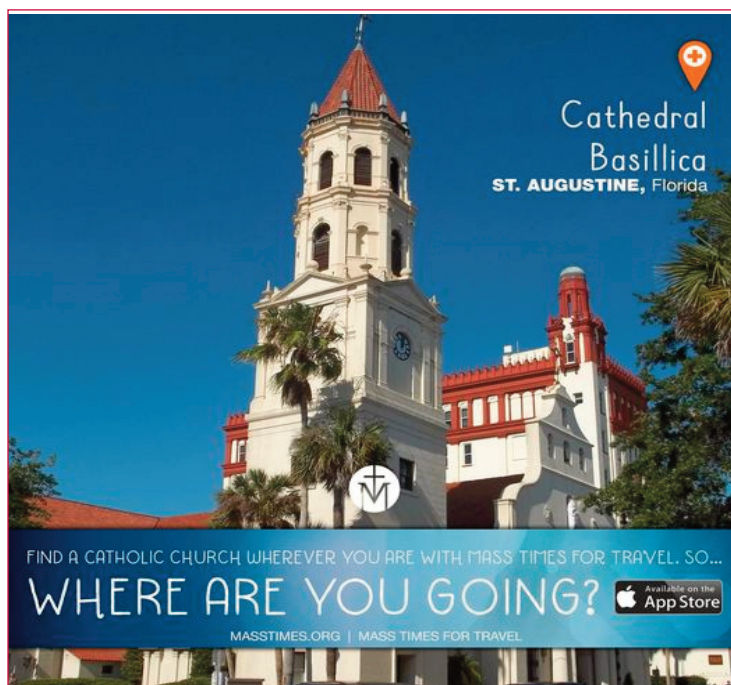
