

Letter from our Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

Thanks to everyone for your generosity in our Easter collection. These couple of years have been a challenge in everyone's life and family. Let us hope and pray that we continue to grow in faith and strengthen our parish life. Your generous response to the support of St. Rose at Easter was tremendous (\$117,448). This represents the most significant Easter collection since 2016. Thank you again.

The archdiocese is inviting us to support their efforts as well. Our goal for this year's Annual Appeal is \$108,248. So far we have contributed \$51,726 to the archdiocese. Please consider a sacrificial gift. As of this year our parish will have to make up the deficit if we do not reach our goal.

The ministries funded by the archdiocese are important in meeting the varied and crucial needs in our church. Of particular importance are the support given to teaching young people the faith (from early catechesis to youth and young adult ministry) and caring for the underserved.

Supporting the hospital and prison ministries and funding Mercy House (assisting pregnant and parenting women in need of a safe and supportive environment). Each week Mercy House distributes 40-50 bags of clothing and household items, and each year over 3,000 bags of food are shared. These are a small picture of why the appeal is so necessary.

Thank you for your support of St. Rose, and also for your assistance to the Cardinal. Please respond to the Annual Appeal if you have not yet done so. Envelopes are available in church and at the rectory.

Our congratulations and prayers for our newly confirmed young people. May the Holy Spirit bless you and your families.

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. READING II

1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

Brothers and sisters:

No one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit.

There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit.

As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ.

For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit.



Pentecost Sunday



Pentecost marks the occasion of God sending the Holy Spirit upon Jesus' disciples after his Resurrection. The book of Acts describes how the disciples were gathered together in one place on the day of Pentecost. The Jewish feast of Pentecost (Shavuot or the Feast of Weeks) was a day that commemorated the giving of the law to Moses, a day soon to be marked as well by the giving of the Holy Spirit.

On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit gave the disciples the strength to fulfill their commission to spread the Good News of Jesus. The Solemnity of Pentecost, which crowns and fulfills the Easter Season, is a good time to pray for a deeper indwelling of the Holy Spirit.

The Marian title of "Mother of the Church," was given to the Blessed Mother by Bl. Pope Paul VI at the Second Vatican Council and today's memorial was decreed by Pope Francis in 2018.

The Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments inscribed the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church in the General Roman Calendar to be observed on the Monday after Pentecost, taking precedence over an obligatory Memorial that coincides with it.

Pope Francis Pentecost

Pentecost arrived, for the disciples, after fifty days of uncertainty. True, Jesus had risen. Overjoyed, they had seen him, listened to his words and even shared a meal with him. Yet they had not overcome their doubts and fears: they met behind closed doors (cf. Jn 20:19.26), uncertain about the future and not ready to proclaim the risen Lord. Then the Holy Spirit comes and their worries disappear. Now the apostles show themselves fearless, even before those sent to arrest them. Previously, they had been worried about saving their lives; now they are unafraid of dying. Earlier, they had huddled in the Upper Room; now they go forth to preach to every nation. Before the ascension of Jesus, they waited for God's kingdom to come to them (cf. Acts 1:6); now they are filled with zeal to travel to unknown lands. Before, they had almost never spoken in public, and when they did, they had often blundered, as when Peter denied Jesus; now they speak with parrhesia to everyone. The disciples' journey seemed to have reached the end of the line, when suddenly they were rejuvenated by the Spirit. Overwhelmed with uncertainty, when they thought everything was over, they were transformed by a joy that gave them a new birth. The Holy Spirit did this. The Spirit is far from being an abstract reality: he is the Person who is most concrete and close, the one who changes our lives. How does he do this? Let us consider the Apostles. The Holy Spirit did not make things easier for them, he didn't work spectacular miracles, he didn't take away their difficulties and their opponents. Rather, the Spirit brought into the lives of the disciples a harmony that had been lacking, his own harmony, for he is harmony.
