

Letter from our Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

Thanks to everyone for your generosity in our Easter collection. These couple of years have been a challenge in everyone's life and family. Let us hope and pray that we continue to grow in faith and strengthen our parish life. Your generous response to the support of St. Rose at Easter was tremendous (\$117,448). This represents the most significant Easter collection since 2016. Thank you again.

The archdiocese is inviting us to support their efforts as well. Our goal for this year's Annual Appeal is \$108,248. So far we have contributed \$51,726 to the archdiocese. Please consider a sacrificial gift. As of this year our parish will have to make up the deficit if we do not reach our goal.

The ministries funded by the archdiocese are important in meeting the varied and crucial needs in our church. Of particular importance are the support given to teaching young people the faith (from early catechesis to youth and young adult ministry) and caring for the underserved.

Supporting the hospital and prison ministries and funding Mercy House (assisting pregnant and parenting women in need of a safe and supportive environment). Each week Mercy House distributes 40-50 bags of clothing and household items, and each year over 3,000 bags of food are shared. These are a small picture of why the appeal is so necessary.

Thank you for your support of St. Rose, and also for your assistance to the Cardinal. Please respond to the Annual Appeal if you have not yet done so. Envelopes are available in church and at the rectory.

Our congratulations and prayers for our newly confirmed young people. May the Holy Spirit bless you and your families.

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY



"The Feast of the Most Holy Trinity leads us to contemplate the mystery of God who unceasingly creates, redeems and sanctifies, always with love and through love."

- Pope Francis, May 27, 2018

The mystery of the Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life. God reveals himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The doctrine of the Trinity includes three truths of faith.

First, the Trinity is One. We do not speak of three gods but one God. Each of the Persons is fully God. They are a unity of Persons in one divine nature.

Second, the Divine Persons are distinct from each other. Father, Son, and Spirit are not three appearances or modes of God, but three identifiable persons, each fully God in a way distinct from the others.

Third, the Divine Persons are in relation to each other. The distinction of each is understood only in reference to the others. The Father cannot be the Father without the Son, nor can the Son be the Son without the Father. The Holy Spirit is related to the Father and Son who both send him forth.

All Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The Trinity illumines all the other mysteries of faith.

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY



This solemnity is sometimes referred to as a "devotional" or "idea feast." That is, it does not connect directly to an event of the paschal mystery of Christ. Emphasis is on belief in the Trinity.

TRINITY TABLE PRAYER

As we sit down at our table we pray that our lives and our concern for the poor always give... Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit now and forever. Amen

THE SIGN OF THE CROSS

Numerous pious exercises have a Trinitarian character or dimension. Most of them begin with the sign of the cross "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit", the same formula with which the disciples of Jesus are baptized (cf. Mt 28, 19), thereby beginning a life of intimacy with the God, as sons of the Father, brothers of Jesus, and temples of the Holy Spirit. We use these words and sign ourselves with the cross thousands of time. Do we do this as a habit or do we reflect on its meaning? "In the name" suggests in the possession of or protection of. The sign of the cross can be understood to be surrender to God, a giving of our whole self to the Triune God. Every time we pray, gather for Mass or to celebrate a sacrament we begin with the sign of the cross "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit", the same formula with which the disciples of Jesus are baptized (cf. Mt 28, 19), thereby beginning a life of intimacy with the God, as sons of the Father, brothers of Jesus, and temples of the Holy Spirit. This is no less true for us, the baptized disciples. The challenged is to make these words and accompanying gesture something other than habit.



GOD IS NOT A UNITARIAN!

Given the choice of believing that God is One, as Unitarians do OR believing that God is One but that the One God is Three Divine Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, I imagine most people would say the first option seems more understandable. The concept of the Holy Trinity, whose feast we celebrate this Sunday, is something beyond our understanding. No matter how we try, we just can't get our minds around it. It's always a mystery.

Yet Catholics and all main-line Christians believe in the Holy Trinity and following the command of Jesus in this Sunday's Gospel, they baptize "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:16-20).

Yet the fact we cannot grasp the Trinity should be expected for God is God and beyond human understanding. The creature cannot fully comprehend its Creator. Besides, none of us can fully comprehend another human being, and at times we even find ourselves surprised at our own reactions and emotions. If we cannot fully understand ourselves or other persons, why do we think we can understand God?

Yet we do get some insight into the Trinity when we recall that God has revealed himself as love. The God who is love is a community of persons united in perfect love. A community of persons that goes beyond itself, for love is always expansive. God is the Father who gives life. God is the Son who reveals mercy and compassion. God is the Spirit who inspires us to love and draws us ever closer to God.

We might conclude that if God were not a Trinity of loving persons, we and all creation might not exist. God just might have been content being a self-contained "unit-arian."







Glory be to the Son,


Who by His Precious Blood delivered me from hell, and opened for me the gates of heaven.

OUR SUNDAY OBLIGATION



"Much obliged" is an old fashioned phrase first noted in the Old Oxford English Dictionary in the sixteenth century. Over the centuries, the phrase has lost some of its richness. Originally, it meant to be bound to a person by ties of gratitude. Today, the phrase is more often used as an automatic response to someone who has performed a perfunctory service. Unfortunately, this practice does not convey the sense of truly being bound to each other by gratitude. What a loss! Because of that loss, many people understand the word *obligation* as a burden rather than a commitment and duty that flows from a relationship. Obligation is a form of indebtedness that comes from within the heart of a relationship.

Think of the obligations that make for a rich family life. A parent does not say, "I wonder if I have to feed my children this week?" Husbands and wives carry out a myriad of obligatory tasks in service to each other during the course of a week and never ask, "Do I have to?" In loving relationships, we are grateful for the gift of each other and we express that gratitude by doing right actions because we want to do so. Obligatory behaviors grow out of communication, intimacy, and personal and communal relationships. These examples can help us reflect on our "obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and

rest from servile labor" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #2041).

The heart of Sunday obligation is gratitude. The word *Eucharist* means "to give thanks." We gather each week because we are "much obliged" to God — for everything. This obligation is not an automatic response to someone who has performed a perfunctory service. We come together to "give thanks" to God, our Father who is the source of all life and creation, and to Jesus, God's Son who gave us eternal life through his death on the Cross that is made present in every Mass as we participate again in Christ's death and Resurrection through the Eucharist

Each time we "attend Mass," we bring our lives, our very selves, to the Eucharist. We gather together as a community, grateful to have each other as fellow pilgrims in faith and grateful to be nourished by the body and blood of Christ. Just as the relationships and obligations in families are nurtured and strengthened by intimacy and communion, so too does our participation in the Eucharist nurture and strengthen our relationship with the Trinity. Food nourishes our body in the same way that our participation in Holy Communion nourishes our spirit and unites us together as individuals and as a community in Christ. Acting on our Sunday obligation of being "much obliged" gives us reason to be "more obliged" in the most authentic sense of obligation.

Stewardship Reflection for the The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity June 12, 2022

In today's Gospel Jesus talks about life with his Father and the Spirit. He tells his disciples that what belongs to the Father belongs to him, and that the Spirit will take from what is his and give it to them. Jesus helps us understand

that the relationship between Father, Son and Spirit is one of perfect sharing and loving generosity. 


