

#### Dear Parishioners,



Coming to Mass is a response to the gifts set out before us. As Melchisedek offered Abram the gifts of bread and wine, so Christ offers us Himself, hidden in these gifts. He asks us to honor Him, to pray to Him, to reverence Him, and as we receive Him He asks that we bring Him as leaven into a world so very much in need.

Here in this house we worship in praise and thanksgiving, in need and in sorrow. We come to be fed at this table and taught at this altar. Our prayers, our music, our distractions and our tears all make their way to heaven from here. The beauty and glory of this house are no mere earthly attributes. They express what happens when we gather in faith, acknowledge our needs and receive what we cannot give ourselves.

In this house we have baptized our children, brought them for Eucharist, celebrated their reconciliation: our young people have watched us, and they come to pray with us.

In this house we have found Christ and received Him. In our academy and our faith formation, in Pre-Cana and social outreach, in scripture sharing and RCIA, in scouting and basketball, the beauty of this house finds purpose.

The joining of spouses, the sounds of our choir, Christmas and Easter, the bishops at Confirmation, Masses of anointing: we are witnesses of joy. And on this altar are tears of small sadness and larger tragedy, family defeats and personal losses. The glory of this house includes the cries of newborns and the silence of our faithful departed. Without them we would be less a family of faith.

In word and sacrament this shelter of this house has nurtured concern and compassion. From our food pantry to our Advent Giving Tree, the gospel goes out and Christ touches so many. The bread of life given here enables us to be bread for the world. The bread of life spreads the beauty and love the One who nourishes us all.

The Eucharist is for those in need, those wandering in, those here every day, those asking pardon, those seeking strength, those losing hope, those coming back: those are each one of us. We come for a glimpse of glory, enough to sustain us. We come to be transformed by the beauty of divine grace. We come together to the right place.

To this house of prayer we come and we will come. This, our home of faith, is meant to prepare us for heaven, and strengthen us for the journey

Thank you to all our parishioners for making St. Rose of Lima an example of faith and discipleship. Our parishioners, each member of our staff, our ministers and volunteers, our Councils and committees, every person here participating through prayer, worship and service, thank you for the experience and life of St. Rose of Lima Parish. I am grateful to you and will always count my being with you a blessing.

May the Lord bless and reward each of you and your families.



#### Stewardship Reflection for the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time June 25/26, 2022

Today's Gospel reveals to us the beginning of Jesus' journey to Jerusalem. We will journey with Jesus for many Sundays to come, and along the way he will teach us about the demands of discipleship. His instructions may seem harsh and unreasonable to our ears. His response to legitimate requests to postpone the journey reminds us that there are always justifiable excuses to defer the journey or put off the responsibilities of discipleship. Other important matters compete for our attention. Some of us must make heart-wrenching choices, but there is urgency about Jesus' mission to bring forth God's kingdom. His demand is that we proclaim the Kingdom of God now. Is this our first priority, or do we have other priorities?
