RE: Introduction of EthicsPoint

DATE: June 27, 2023

On behalf of Cardinal Tobin and the Archdiocesan leadership team, I am pleased to announce the upcoming launch of the EthicsPoint, an independent reporting service that allows employees, parishioners, volunteers, clergy, religious, vendors, or other individuals to submit concerns about suspected unethical behavior, misuse of resources or financial misconduct within our Archdiocese anytime. EthicsPoint will be live as of July 1, 2023, and can be accessed via a dedicated [website](#) or toll-free number.

Please follow this [link](#) to read Cardinal Tobin's introduction of EthicsPoint. As he states, "Together we are stewards of this local Church, and one of our significant responsibilities is to manage the financial resources entrusted to our care. The Archdiocese of Newark is committed to the highest standards of conduct and ethics and strives for accountability and transparency in all we do in serving our mission. Our stewardship includes financial transparency and responsibility."

The reporting system is NOT intended to receive information about misconduct or sexual abuse allegations. Abuse allegations should be reported immediately and directly to local law enforcement, and to the Office of the Protection of the Faithful at 973-497-4254.

If you see or suspect misconduct by any person associated with the Archdiocese of Newark in any parish, school, or archdiocesan office, please report your concerns to EthicsPoint. To learn more about EthicsPoint, visit [online](#).





Dear St. Rose of Lima Parishioners and Friends,

In 2020, a dedicated group of parishioners along with our Pastor began a "Steps Committee". The goal of this committee was to address the deterioration of the steps in front of St. Rose of Lima Church. Over the last 15 years, there have been three (3) major repairs to the church steps. Since the completion of these major repairs, we have encountered additional deterioration which has lead to further repairs and expense.

Over the last three years, the Steps Committee has met with several engineers and architects. These professionals were tasked with assessing the damage and offer guidance in regards to overall repair, design, structural/public safety and the minimization of projected future maintenance expense. After review of these assesments, the Steps Committee determined that the most cost-effective manner in which to address the continued deterioration is to completely replace the steps while maintaining the beauty of our church.

The projected investment for this project is \$400,000.00. We had hoped to achieve this goal and commence the project this year. As of June 1, 2023 we have not reached our goal and therefore have moved the start date of this project to June 2024.

We ask you to please offer help St. Rose of Lima to achieve this goal. Your generosity in whatever amount you can contribute will ensure that St. Rose of Lima proudly and beautifully continues in the years ahead for generations to come.

The Order of the Knights of Columbus is the world's largest Catholic fraternal service organization. It was founded in the United States in 1882 by Fr. Michael J. McGivney at St. Mary's Parish in New Haven Connecticut to pool funds to care for the local families of mostly Catholic, immigrant coal miners who had died or become disabled in their occupation.

It is named in honor of Christopher Columbus and dedicated to the principles of Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism. The Knights' motto is "In Service to One, In Service to All".

Our local St. Rose of Lima Council 6386 is celebrating their 50th anniversary with some of our charter members still active. They have raised over \$350,000.00 for charities in the past 15 years. The Council raised more than \$30,000.00 for seed money the purchase of 3 ultrasound machines for pregnancy care centers. Their annual projects include "Coats for Kids" raising more than \$32,000.00 in the past 5 years to provide over 1,400 winter coats for local needy children. And, a gala event raised \$10,000 for Magnificat House in Jersey City which provides room and shelter to single people, mostly women, in repurposed convents.

In the 10 years before covid, the St Rose Council also raised over \$100,000 for Alzheimer's research, \$60,000 for scholarships for local students, \$125,000 for Intellectual Disability home support. This was carried out by St Rose parishioners providing modest amounts of volunteer time together to achieve these goals.

The K of C has always supported the Parish both financially and with donated labor and materials when needed around the Parish campus.

Our Sunday Obligation

“Much obliged” is an old fashioned phrase first noted in the Old Oxford English Dictionary in the sixteenth century. Over the centuries, the phrase has lost some of its richness. Originally, it meant to be bound to a person by ties of gratitude. Today, the phrase is more often used as an automatic response to someone who has performed a perfunctory service. Unfortunately, this practice does not convey the sense of truly being bound to each other by gratitude. What a loss! Because of that loss, many people understand the word obligation as a burden rather than a commitment and duty that flows from a relationship. Obligation is a form of indebtedness that comes from within the heart of a relationship. Think of the obligations that make for a rich family life. A parent does not say, “I wonder if I have to feed my children this week?” Husbands and wives carry out a myriad of obligatory tasks in service to each other during the course of a week and never ask, “Do I have to?” In loving relationships, we are grateful for the gift of each other and we express that gratitude by doing right actions because we want to do so. Obligatory behaviors grow out of communication, intimacy, and personal and communal relationships. These examples can help us reflect on our “obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor”.

(Catechism of the Catholic Church, #2041)




The heart of Sunday obligation is gratitude. The word Eucharist means “to give thanks.” We gather each week because we are “much obliged” to God — for everything. This obligation is not an automatic response to someone who has performed a perfunctory service. We come together to “give thanks” to God, our Father who is the source of all life and creation, and to Jesus, God’s Son who gave us eternal life through his death on the Cross that is made present in every Mass as we participate again in Christ’s death and Resurrection through the Eucharist.

Each time we “attend Mass,” we bring our lives, our very selves, to the Eucharist. We gather together as a community, grateful to have each other as fellow pilgrims in faith and grateful to be nourished by the body and blood of Christ. Just as the relationships and obligations in families are nurtured and strengthened by intimacy and communion, so too does our participation in the Eucharist nurture and strengthen our relationship with the Trinity. Food nourishes our body in the same way that our participation in Holy Communion nourishes our spirit and unites us together as individuals and as a community in Christ. Acting on our Sunday obligation of being “much obliged” gives us reason to be “more obliged” in the most authentic sense of obligation. – Maureen A. Kelly


