On July 1, 2026, four members of the Society of Saint Pius X were consecrated bishops without the appropriate pontifical mandate. As a consequence, both the ordaining bishops and the bishops who received the ordination incurred a *latae sententiae* excommunication (canon 1387). The Decree formally recognizing the excommunication was signed on the next day by Cardinal Víctor Manuel Fernández, Prefect of the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, and countersigned by the two Secretaries of the same Dicastery.

In the same Decree, three additional consequences of the illicit ordinations were enumerated:

1. The sacred ministers belonging to the Society of Saint Pius X are in schism and must therefore be considered schismatics.
2. The lay faithful, those who formally adhere to the Society of Saint Pius X, are to be considered schismatics and excommunicated. Formal adherence consists of the internal ascent to place obedience to the Society over obedience to the Roman Pontiff, and exteriorly, to attend exclusively their ecclesial acts (see the Explanatory Note issued by the Pontifical Council for Legislative Texts on August 24, 1996).
3. The sacred ministers of the Society of Saint Pius X administer the sacraments illicitly, and that the sacrament of penance administered by them and marriages assisted by them are invalid.

For the faithful of the Archdiocese of Newark who wish to participate in the liturgical rites according to the Missal antecedent to the reform of 1970 (formerly called the extraordinary form of the Roman Rite), there are four options presently available:

1. The Oratory of Saint Anthony of Padua in West Orange, administered by the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest.
2. Our Lady of Sorrows Church in Jersey City.
3. Our Lady of Victories Church in Harrington Park.

The priests, religious, and faithful of the archdiocese are reminded that they are obliged to maintain communion with the Church (canon 209 §1). Let us work together to maintain and promote ecclesial communion.

**You might have noticed that there seems to be sediment
when receiving the precious Blood of Christ.
What are they and Why are they in the wine?**

Wine makers affectionately refer to these harmless crystals as “Wine Diamonds.” These crystals, often found stuck to the bottom of the cork and the bottle itself, are indicators of a well-crafted wine. Contrary to popular belief, they are not sugar crystals, yeast, or even broken glass! These small crystals naturally form in both red and white wines when the wine is chilled. This occurs because the acid present in all grapes attaches to proteins in the wine. However, this process only happens in wines that haven’t been chemically altered or cold-stabilized. So, if you’re fortunate enough to discover this treasure within your bottle, you can now confidently say that you’re savoring a healthy wine. —Brook Hollow Winery

At St. Rose of Lima, we meticulously strain the wine before pouring it into the Mass cruet. Our Mass wine is of exceptional quality.

OUR SUNDAY OBLIGATION



“Much obliged” is an old fashioned phrase first noted in the Old Oxford English Dictionary in the sixteenth century. Over the centuries, the phrase has lost some of its richness. Originally, it meant to be bound to a person by ties of gratitude. Today, the phrase is more often used as an automatic response to someone who has performed a perfunctory service. Unfortunately, this practice does not convey the sense of truly being bound to each other by gratitude. What a loss! Because of that loss, many people understand the word *obligation* as a burden rather than a commitment and duty that flows from a relationship. Obligation is a form of indebtedness that comes from within the heart of a relationship.

Think of the obligations that make for a rich family life. A parent does not say, “I wonder if I have to feed my children this week?” Husbands and wives carry out a myriad of obligatory tasks in service to each other during the course of a week and never ask, “Do I have to?” In loving relationships, we are grateful for the gift of each other and we express that gratitude by doing right actions because we want to do so. Obligatory behaviors grow out of communication, intimacy, and personal and communal relationships. These examples can help us reflect on our “obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and

rest from servile labor” (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, #2041).

The heart of Sunday obligation is gratitude. The word *Eucharist* means “to give thanks.” We gather each week because we are “much obliged” to God — for everything. This obligation is not an automatic response to someone who has performed a perfunctory service. We come together to “give thanks” to God, our Father who is the source of all life and creation, and to Jesus, God’s Son who gave us eternal life through his death on the Cross that is made present in every Mass as we participate again in Christ’s death and Resurrection through the Eucharist.

Each time we “attend Mass,” we bring our lives, our very selves, to the Eucharist. We gather together as a community, grateful to have each other as fellow pilgrims in faith and grateful to be nourished by the body and blood of Christ. Just as the relationships and obligations in families are nurtured and strengthened by intimacy and communion, so too does our participation in the Eucharist nurture and strengthen our relationship with the Trinity. Food nourishes our body in the same way that our participation in Holy Communion nourishes our spirit and unites us together as individuals and as a community in Christ. Acting on our Sunday obligation of being “much obliged” gives us reason to be “more obliged” in the most authentic sense of obligation.

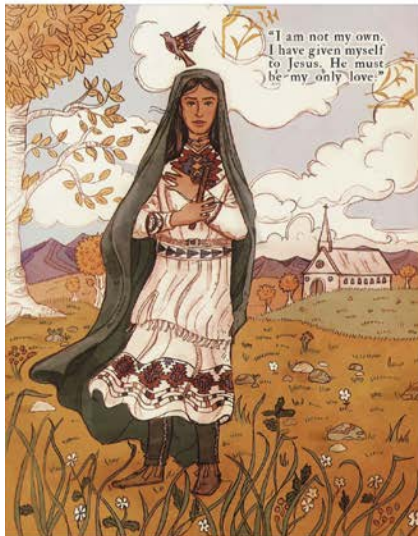


A SUMMER POPE FRANCIS NOTE



The parable of the Sower speaks to each of us today, as it spoke to the listeners of Jesus two thousand years ago. It reminds us that we are the land where the Lord tirelessly throws the seed of His Word and His love. What is our disposition when we receive it? How is our heart? What does the ground look like: a path, a stone, a thorn bush? It's up to us to become good soil without thorns or stones, but tilled and cultivated with care, so that it can bring forth good fruit for us and for our brothers.

At every Mass, the good seed of the Gospel is sown in us ever anew, by means of the table of the Word of God: a seed to be accepted, to safeguard, to live. **Even in these summer months, during the holiday period, it is important to participate every Sunday at this table, to draw light and strength for our journey.**



St. Kateri Tekakwitha

1656 - April 17, 1680

Feastday: July 14

St. Kateri Tekakwitha, the first Native American to be recognized as a saint by the Catholic Church. Born in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon. Her mother was an Algonquin, who was captured by the Mohawks and was married to a Mohawk chief.

At four-years-old she contracted smallpox which scarred her skin becoming a source of humiliation in her youth. She often wore a blanket to hide her face. Her entire family died during the outbreak. She was adopted and raised by her uncle, chief of a Mohawk clan.

At 19, Kateri converted to Catholicism, taking a vow of chastity. Her name, Kateri, is the Mohawk form of Catherine, which she took from St. Catherine of Siena. Her decision not to marry was unpopular with her adopted parents and neighbors, some of whom started rumors of sorcery. To avoid persecution, she traveled 200 miles to a Christian native community south of Montreal.

St. Kateri Tekakwitha was Beatified by Pope John Paul II and canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on Oct. 21, 2012. She is the patroness of ecology and the environment, people in exile and Native Americans.

The height of gastronomy is celebrated in Lyon, along with wine, art, architecture, scenery and history – all coming together in glorious harmony in the South of France.

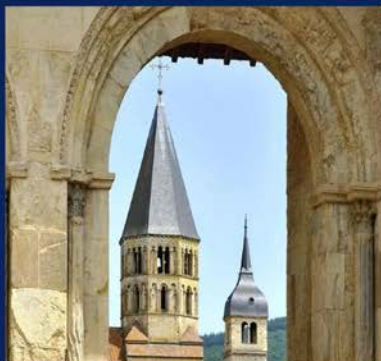
Our adventure will begin with our departure from Newark airport on Tuesday, 13 April 2027 and returning to Newark on Wednesday, 21 April 2027.

The price of the trip is \$5,100.00 per person based on double occupancy which includes the cost of the ship, excursions and transportation to and from the airport in Lyon. We recommend that each person book their own flight. Often people get pricing cheaper than what we can offer. Specific flight information will be available in July '26. You should set aside about \$1,500.00 (economy seating) for your flight, though as I said, by booking on your own, you may come up with something cheaper.
