

and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more."


#### PROFESSION OF FAITH



Monday, August 15 • Holy Day Obligation to attend Mass is abrogated.


#### Mass Schedule 8AM

- On November 1, 1950 Pope Pius XII defined the assumption of Mary's body and soul into heaven to be
  a dogma of the Church. However, long before mid-twentieth century, August 15 as a feast day honoring
  Mary has been celebrated—since about the fifth century. Originally this day celebrated her birthday; that
  is, her death. When the early calendar began to develop, a holy person's death day was considered his or
  her "birth" into eternal life. In the eighth century we have a feast day actually named the "Assumption of
  Holy Mary."
- Mary's greatness comes from her participation in God's plan for salvation and from her surrender and
  fidelity to it. This is the posture of genuine discipleship and the challenge of this gospel and the
  solemnity: that we, too, allow God to work great things in and through us so that one day, we, too, might
  share in the same glory. Like Mary, our whole being must proclaim the "greatness of the Lord" not only
  by prayer and praise that is on out lips but the good deeds of our daily living.

Each kit contains a backpack filled with all the school supplies for that particular level and they are all very reasonably priced. *Note*: shipping costs will be added to the price.








The year 2020 marked the 1,600th anniversary of the death of Saint Jerome, the great translator of the Bible. Recognizing his work to make Sacred Scripture more accessible to all in the Church, the Catholic Biblical Federation declared 2020 to be the Year of the Word of God. The faithful worldwide were encouraged to grow through reading, studying, and living the Scriptures.

In observance of this special occasion, the Zambia Conference of Catholic Bishops used a grant from the Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa to organize a National Bible Congress and diocesan training sessions for lectors and prayer leaders who conduct prayers in the absence of a priest. 


