Obligation to attend Mass is abrogated.

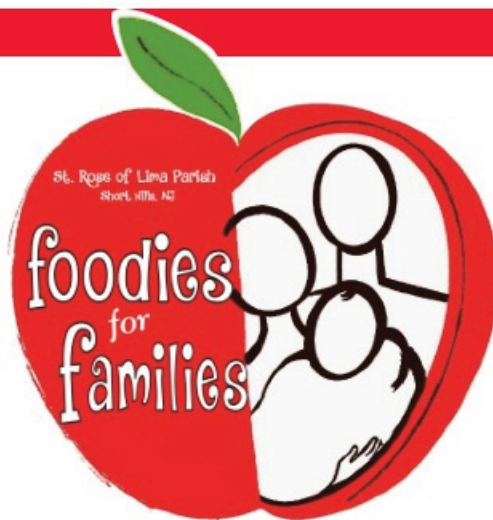

- On November 1, 1950 Pope Pius XII defined the assumption of Mary's body and soul into heaven to be a dogma of the Church. However, long before mid-twentieth century, August 15 as a feast day honoring Mary has been celebrated—since about the fifth century. Originally this day celebrated her birthday; that is, her death. When the early calendar began to develop, a holy person's death day was considered his or her "birth" into eternal life. In the eighth century we have a feast day actually named the "Assumption of Holy Mary."
- Mary's greatness comes from her participation in God's plan for salvation and from her surrender and fidelity to it. This is the posture of genuine discipleship and the challenge of this gospel and the solemnity: that we, too, allow God to work great things in and through us so that one day, we, too, might share in the same glory. Like Mary, our whole being must proclaim the "greatness of the Lord" not only by prayer and praise that is on our lips but the good deeds of our daily living.

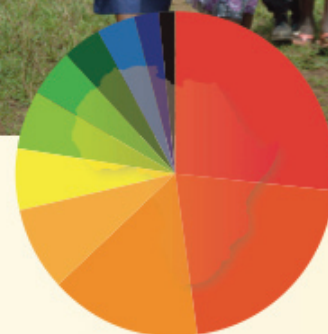

Reporting Abuse

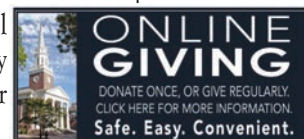

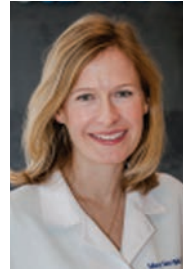
