AS OUR CHILDREN GO TO COLLEGE

Parenthood has two big transitions, when your children arrive and when they leave. The Church marks their arrival with Baptism that sets them on the journey of life - a fascinating adventure in the Holy Spirit - as family members and parish communities celebrate with tears of joy. Each August, these same tears well up in our eyes as we face our kids going off to college.

Here is wisdom offered to parents by Marshall P. Duke, Professor at Emory University.

"It is a moment that comes along once in a lifetime. Each child only starts college once.
...Such moments are rare. They have power. They give us as parents one-time opportunities to say things to our children that will stick with them not only because of what is said, but because of when it is said.

Here is what I tell the parents: think of what you want to tell your children when you finally take leave of them and they go off to their dorm and the beginning of their new chapter in life and you set out for the slightly emptier house that you will now live in. What thoughts, feelings and advice do you want to stick? "Always make your bed!"? "Don't wear your hair that way!"? Surely not. This is a moment to tell them the big things. Things you feel about them as children, as people. Wise things. Things that have guided you in your life. Ways that you hope they will live. Ways that you hope they will be. Big things. Life-level things."

Professor Duke suggests writing our college bound teenagers a letter to impart to your now independent child all the important things you want them to know and remember.

Sounds like a good idea! Parental wisdom put to paper that they can reread when they are lonely or struggling or at times they want to be reminded that "you have their back".

Sharing the wisdom of a now deceased parishioner, who reminded hundreds of children in religious education as a parish catechist.

Jesus is your best friend! Don't forget it!

Stewardship Reflection for the Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time August 28, 2022

In today's Gospel, Jesus challenged the social structure of the Pharisees and teaches his hosts and their guests some profound lessons in humility. Pharisees maintained deep social divisions between who they considered "holy" and "unholy," rich and poor, honored and despised. They didn't invite someone to a banquet or dinner who couldn't reciprocate. And the lowly, the poor, the crippled, the lame and the blind had no capacity to reciprocate.

Good stewards realize that if they embrace a humility that allows them to be generous to those who cannot repay them, they give evidence of having the kind of heart that will enjoy the Lord's intimate friendship. This week let's reflect on our attitude towards those who cannot repay our generosity. What is the extent of our hospitality toward others? Are we generous with those who cannot repay us?






