

The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary September 8

Other than Jesus himself and various commemorations of the unfolding paschal mystery, no one else has as many festivals on our liturgical calendar as does Mary. These festivals for the most part are quite ancient, and both their number and antiquity witness to the high regard the Church has for Mary. This particular feast day also cannot be separated from one nine months previous to it, Mary's immaculate conception. In both her conception and birth Mary is honored as the one who is free from sin and worthy to be the mother of God.

Until the annunciation, we know nothing about Mary's life—nothing about her parents, her birth, and her childhood. We can learn a lesson from this. Mary's "lowliness," simplicity, humility all direct us to her whole life being only in relation to Jesus. All of the accolades the Church heaps on Mary come after Mary's life. During her life she quietly went about her yes to God, growing in holiness, bearing the divine Son, being a faithful disciple. Mary models for us a "hidden life". The gospel for this feast is the one about Joseph desiring to divorce Mary quietly because "she was found with child." What courage it must have taken for Mary to say yes to Gabriel, to trust in God enough to risk her betrothal and her future! Such trust Mary must have learned from birth, through the guidance and care of her own parents.

We celebrate today Mary's nativity, a birth that challenges us to grow in holiness, to be constantly faithful to God's call, and to trust that all God asks of us will be fruitful. Mary's birth into human life paves the way for all of us to be born into eternal life. We are grateful for Mary's yes and for her being the mother of the Church and our mother, too.



The cost per person is \$57.27 and includes the driver's tip.



St. Rose Council 6386 CELEBRATES 50 YEARS OF SERVICE

- \$350,000 raised for charities in past 15 years.
- \$30,000 Raised for the purchase of 3 ultrasonic machines for pregnancy care centers. Machines and their respective images of the fetus has resulted in 92% full term pregnancies.

ANNIVERSA

- \$32,000 raised for 1,400 Coats for Kids.
- Support for the Parish both financially and with donated labor and materials.

The Order of the Knights of Columbus is the world's largest Catholic fraternal service organization. It was founded in the United States in 1882 by Fr. Michael J. McGivney at St. Mary's Parish in New Haven Connecticut to pool funds to care for the local families of mostly Catholic, immigrant coal miners who had died or become disabled in their occupation.

It is named in honor of Christopher Columbus and dedicated to the principles of Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism. The Knights' motto is "In Service to One, In Service to All".

Our local St. Rose of Lima Council 6386 is celebrating their 50th anniversary with some of our charter members still active. They have raised over \$350,000.00 for charities in the past 15 years. The Council raised more than \$30,000.00 for seed money the purchase of 3 ultrasound machines for pregnancy care centers. Their annual projects include "Coats for Kids" raising more than \$32,000.00 in the past 5 years to provide over 1,400 winter coats for local needy children. And, a gala event raised \$10,000 for Magnificat House in Jersey City which provides room and shelter to single people, mostly women, in repurposed convents.

In the 10 years before covid, the St Rose Council also raised over \$100,000 for Alzheimer's research, \$60,000 for scholarships for local students, \$125,000 for Intellectual Disability home support. This was carried out by St Rose parishioners providing modest amounts of volunteer time together to achieve these goals.

The K of C has always supported the Parish both financially and with donated labor and materials when needed around the Parish campus.
