



New Mother Teresa Documentary Celebrates Saint's Life on 25th Anniversary

The definitive film on Mother Teresa will hit select U.S. theaters on October 3 and 4, 2022.

As the Catholic Church marks 25 years since the death of St. Teresa of Calcutta, or Mother Teresa, the Knights of Columbus are honoring the foundress of the Missionaries of Charity with a new documentary. 



St. Vincent de Paul Feast Day: September 27

St. Vincent de Paul was ordained at the age of 20. In 1605 he was captured by Barbary pirates who sold him into slavery, but won his freedom after he converted one of his masters to Christianity. After returning to France, he served as a parish priest near Paris and began to establish charitable organizations that helped the poor, nursed the sick and found work for the unemployed. St Vincent founded the Congregation of the Daughters of Charity with Louise de Marillac, and instituted the Congregation of Priests of the Mission, also known as the Lazarists. Today the Society of St. Vincent de Paul provides relief to people in need across the world.



Stewardship Reflection for the Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time September 25, 2022

In today's Gospel Jesus offers a warning about living selfishly in his parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus. The Rich Man holds sumptuous feasts and dresses in fine clothes. But despite his affluence he does nothing to relieve the painful hunger and debilitating condition of his neighbor Lazarus. He neglects to love his neighbor as he loves himself and is sent to hell for his lifestyle and desire for self-gratification. The Rich Man represents those who spend their money on their own personal pleasures with no regard for sharing their material possessions with the poor and needy in their own neighborhood. Good stewards realize the practical implications of not only loving God, but loving their neighbor as they would love themselves. Who are the less fortunate in our neighborhood? Do we share a portion of our own blessings with them?


with stressful family situations. Please help Catholic Charities in its mission to help individuals and families who are hurting. This is a most opportune
