





*Celebrate the 800th Anniversary
of the Canticle of the Creatures by
St. Francis of Assisi and the
10th Anniversary of
Pope Francis' encyclical
"Laudato Si"*





In this Jubilee year the Church celebrates the 800th Anniversary of the Canticle of the Creatures by St. Francis of Assisi. The poetic text was written by the founder of the Franciscan Order and dates back to 1224 — two years before his death. It is one of the oldest texts in Italian literature. The Canticle consists of 23 verses dedicated to different parts of creation, like the sun and moon, wind and water.

The Canticle of the Creatures

by St. Francis of Assisi

Most High, all-powerful,
good Lord,
yours is the praise,
the glory and the honor
and every blessing.

To you alone, Most High,
do they belong,
and no one is worthy
to speak your name.

Praised be you, my Lord
with all your creatures,
especially Sir Brother Sun,
who is the day through whom
you bring us light.

And he is lovely, shining
with great splendor,
for he heralds you, Most High.

Praised be you, my Lord,
through Sister Moon and Stars.
In heaven you have formed them,
lightsome and precious and fair.

And praised be you, my Lord,
through Brother Wind, through
air and cloud, through calm
and every weather by which
you sustain your creatures.

Praised be you, my Lord,
through Sister Water,
so very useful and humble,
precious and chaste.

Praised be you, my Lord

through Brother Fire,
by whom you light up
the night, and he is
handsome and merry,
robust and strong.

Praised be you, my Lord,
through our Sister, Mother Earth,
who sustains us and directs us
bringing forth all kinds of fruits
and colored flowers and herbs.

Praised be you, my Lord
through those who forgive
for your love
and who bear sickness and trial.

Blessed are those
who endure in peace,
for by you, Most High,
they will be crowned.

Praised be you, my Lord,

can escape.

Laudato Si'

What is Laudato Si'? Laudato Si' is an encyclical of Pope Francis published in May 2015. It focuses on care for the natural environment and all people, as well as broader questions of the relationship between God, humans, and the Earth. The encyclical's subtitle, "Care for Our Common Home," reinforces these key themes.

An encyclical is a public letter from the Pope developing Catholic teaching on a topic often in light of current events. Laudato Si' is addressed to "every living person on this planet" (LS 3). Hence, it is offered as part of an ongoing dialogue within the Catholic Church and between Catholics and the wider world.



What does Laudato Si' mean? The title of an encyclical is typically drawn from the first words of the document. That is, encyclicals do not receive a topical title, but are instead named by their opening phrase, often one suggestive of a major theme of the work.

The first words of Laudato Si' are Italian and translate as "praise be to you." They are part of a quotation from St. Francis of Assisi's "Canticle of the Creatures" that opens the encyclical in which the saint praises God by meditating on the goodness of sun, wind, Earth, water, and other natural forces.

The choice of this passage to begin Laudato Si' is a reminder of how people of faith should not only respect the Earth but also praise and honor God through their engagement with creation.

How does Laudato Si' relate to past Catholic teaching? Pope Francis is not the first pope to address environmental issues. Pope St. John Paul II taught on numerous occasions about a duty of stewardship toward nature. For example, in his 1991 encyclical *Centesimus Annus*, John Paul II wrote about nature as a gift from God and the need for humans to cooperate with God in promoting the rightly ordered flourishing of the environment (CA 37). Further, *Centesimus Annus* outlined a connection between natural ecology and "human ecology" (CA 38), anticipating the concept of integral ecology in Laudato Si'. Pope Benedict echoed these same teachings during his papacy, for example, in his 2009 encyclical *Caritas in Veritate* (see CV 48-52).

As outlined in Laudato Si', its vision of an integrated approach to concern for all people and the environment has roots in Scripture and the history of Catholic thought, in particular in the tradition of Catholic Social Teaching, tracing back to the late 19th century. Further, Catholic scholars and activists have been outspoken on the connection between social and environmental issues for many years.

What is unique about Laudato Si' is how Pope Francis develops and expands on these themes at length in a highly prominent way, devoting an entire encyclical to the topic at a time when the wider world is also becoming actively engaged in the pursuit of environmental sustainability.

SAINT OF THE WEEK - OCTOBER 7

Our Lady of the Rosary

This feast derives from the feast of St. Mary of Victory, instituted by the dominican Pope Pius V after the defeat of the Turkish Fleet at Lepanto on October 7, 1571 Pope Gregory XIII made it obligatory for Rome and for the Confraternity of the Holy Rosary in 1573. In 1716 Pope Clement XI inscribed the feast in the Roman Calendar for the first Sunday in October.

Counting one's prayers on beads is a very ancient form of praying, used by Muslims and the people of India. It seems that the repetition of the *Hail Mary* on the beads of the rosary goes back to the twelfth century. Around the year 1328 a treatise named *Rosarius* referred to St. Dominic as the promulgator of the rosary. In the fifteenth century the Dominican Alan de la Roche emerged as an outstanding preacher of the "Psalter of Our Lady," a term he preferred to the term "rosary." The title of this feast was changed from *Holy Rosary to Our Lady of the Rosary* in 1960. By

meditating on the mysteries of the rosary we are able to draw near to Mary and with her to recall the mysteries of our redemption.

*On this feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary
we praise, bless and proclaim your name.*

*Consenting to the divine word,
Mary became the Mother of God; embracing your saving will,
she became the handmaid of the Lord; devoting herself to the life and work of your Son,
Mary cooperated in the mystery of redemption.
Because of this she stands before us mother and model of the Church.*




