

CHRIST THE KING

The Liturgical Year's End



Now celebrated on the last Sunday of the liturgical year, the solemnity of Christ the King was originally observed on the last Sunday of October.

This feast with its emphasis on Christ's second coming and final sovereignty over all creation is the perfect note on which to end one year and look forward to the next.



THE LITURGICAL YEAR

The liturgical year begins on the First Sunday of Advent and ends on the Saturday following the Solemnity of Christ the King.

It is divided into six seasons—Advent, Christmas season, Lent, Triduum, Easter season, and Ordinary Time.

The major seasons of Advent and Christmas focus on the mystery of the incarnation; that is, the entering into our world of the second person of the blessed trinity as the man, Jesus of Nazareth.

The major seasons of Lent, Triduum, and Easter focus on the paschal mystery; that is, the dying and rising of that same Jesus.

The entire rest of the year, the period of Ordinary Time, gives all of us an opportunity to focus on what those mysteries mean to us as individuals and as community.

Reflection- We Have A Share in the Lord's Kingship!

The very title "Christ the King" would seem to indicate that we end the Liturgical year with more than a note of triumph power and glory. It is only fitting that we who proclaim Christ's rule and kingdom week after week should pause this week to acclaim him as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. And yet this in not the essence of this feast.

The solemnity we celebrate this day is of Christ's kingship and our share in his lordship, but this share comes from forsaking glory and being servants of one another; not respecting honor and riches, but in respecting truth to which our King gave his life as a witness. We share in the glory of Christ's kingdom:

a kingdom of truth and life,

a kingdom of holiness and grace,

a kingdom of justice, love and peace.






