

Today's liturgy not only offers us a glimpse into the life of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

but also gives us an opportunity to pray for our own families. Although private devotions to the Holy Family go back to about the seventeenth century, the feast did not enter the church's calendar until 1921.

The feast of the holy family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph (Sunday in the Christmas octave) is a festive occasion particularly suitable for the celebration of rites or moments of prayer proper to the Christian family. Some of these rites and prayers are included here for use in the home—the domestic Church!

Holy Family - Table Prayer

Prayed before main meal of the day.

Lord,
on the night before you died,
you gave your friends bread and wine as a sign
that you wanted to be with us always
and to give yourself to us in love
so that we could have new life.
We pray today
that as we share together this food and drink
we may be aware that you are here with us;
that we may care for one another in love;
and bring new life to one another
by sharing your life.
We ask this in your name, Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

Blessing of A Family

We bless your name, O Lord, for sending your own incarnate Son, to become part of a family, so that, as he lived its life, he would experience its worries and its joys.

We ask you, Lord, to protect and watch over this family, so that in the strength of your grace its members may enjoy prosperity, possess the priceless gift of your peace, and, as the Church alive in the home, bear witness in this world to your glory. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen

Blessing For a New Year

Remember us, O God; from age to age be our comforter. You have given us the wonder of time, blessings in days and nights, seasons and years. Bless us, your children, at the turning of the year and fill the months ahead with the bright hope that is ours in the coming of Christ. You are our God, living and reigning forever and ever. AMEN



Reflection—"I'll Be Home For Christmas"

To idealize "home and hearth" can be a part of the Christmas mystique; part of the Christmas reality involves being with family and loved ones. Home has been described as the place where, when you show up they have to take you in, or as a haven in a heartless world. Whatever one's definition, it is clear that what is meant by "home" is not a domicile or a "house." "Home" carries with it associations of relatedness, intimacy, or acceptance, and belonging. To speak of home automatically triggers many and varied associations. It is not a neutral word.

Is it any wonder that the many involved in evangelizing and outreach efforts in the Church today speaks of such programs as "welcome home" because without the alienated and estranged the church is without members of its family? An important challenge is to help people feel "at home." It is not just reaching the marginal and inviting them back that matters. It is welcoming them home and making them feel accepted, not judged for God has created every human person out of love and wishes to grant him or her eternal life in the communion of the Trinity. Such efforts are not the preserve of committees, much less the clergy and religious. It is the task of the baptized.

Such is the challenge of today's feast. It is not primarily concerned with domestic relations, self-help techniques for getting along, or being concerned with one's immediate family only. It means that we open our arms to embrace our brothers and sisters in faith, and realize that when we gather for worship, we gather as family, members of the household of God.



Prayer for the New Year

On New Year's Eve or New Year's Day, the household gathers at the table or at the Christmas tree or manger scene. Many people make New Year's Day a day of prayer for peace.

All make the sign of the cross. The leader begins:

Let us praise the Lord of days and seasons and years, saying: Glory to God in the highest!

R/. And peace to his people on earth!

The leader may use these or similar words to introduce the blessing:

Our lives are made of days and nights, of seasons and years, for we are part of a universe of suns and moons and planets. We mark ends and we make beginnings and, in all, we praise God for the grace and mercy that fill our days.

Then the Scripture is read, Book of Genesis 1:14-19:

Listen to the words of the Book of Genesis:

God said: "Let there be lights in the dome of the sky, to separate day from night. Let them mark the fixed times, the days and the years, and serve as luminaries in the dome of the sky, to shed light upon the earth." And so it happened: God made the two great lights, the greater one to govern the day, and the lesser one to govern the night; and he made the stars. God set them in the dome of the sky, to shed light upon the earth, to govern the day and the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. God saw how good it was. Evening came, and morning followed—the fourth day.

(The family's Bible may be used for an alternate reading such as Psalm 90:1-4.)

Reader: The Word of the Lord. R/. Thanks be to God.

After a time of silence, members of the household offer prayers of thanksgiving for the past year, and of intercession for the year to come. On January 1, it may be appropriate to conclude these prayers with the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary (in Part VII: Litanies) since this is the solemn feast of Mary, Mother of God. In conclusion, all join hands for the Lord's Prayer. Then the leader continues:

Let us now pray for God's blessing in the new year.

After a short silence, parents may place their hands on their children in

blessing as the leader says:

Remember us, O God; from age to age be our comforter. You have given us the wonder of time, blessings in days and nights, seasons and years. Bless your children at the turning of the year and fill the months ahead with the bright hope that is ours in the coming of Christ. You are our God, living and reigning, forever and ever.

R/. Amen.

Another prayer for peace may be said:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace:
where there is hatred, let me sow love;
where there is injury, pardon;
where there is doubt, faith;
where there is despair, hope;
where there is darkness, light;
where there is sadness, joy.
O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek
to be consoled as to console,
to be understood as to understand,
to be loved as to love.
For it is in giving that we receive,
it is in pardoning that we are pardoned,
it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. R/. Amen.

All respond, making the sign of the cross:

Thanks be to God.

The prayer may conclude with the singing of a Christmas carol.


